1. New Topics
 - a. School-Parent Liaisons
 - b. PAC Membership/Bylaws
 - i. Link to bylaws was emailed out
 - ii. Bylaws state they must be reviewed at first meeting
 - iii. Any proposed changes will be voted upon at 2nd meeting
 - iv. Wendy Gruninger hit highlights of bylaws regarding purpose, responsibilities, membership, and responsibilities (power point handout distributed)
 - c. CIP Summary (handout of Continuous Improvement Summary Map distributed)
 - i. Learning & Achievement for All
 1. Math, Reading, & Science SOL Pass Advance rates for EL Learners will increase by 3%
 - a. Parent question regarding what high-dosage tutoring is and how it is implemented – still have regular teacher, but a teacher pushes in to shift teacher/student ratio and allow more intensive support
 - b. Mrs. Gruninger asked how many EL learners are at BFHS – 90 students (most are level 4)

2. Math, Reading, & Science SOL Past Advance rates for Special Ed students will increase by 3%
3. Successful completion of an Advanced (weighted) course will increase by 3% for each student group
 - a. Teacher training to use Equal Opportunity Schools for recommendation for advanced classes
 - i. Parent question regarding the possibility of connecting this process to MS also to set students up for HS. Different parent suggested that we have crossover representatives between MS & HS to help with this?
 - ii. How do you remove teacher bias when they are making recommendations?
- ii. Positive Climate & Culture – Discussion of the importance of survey completion
 1. 80% of students will report satisfaction with school Climate with increased satisfaction for school belonging, mental health, social emotional learning, & bullying
 - a. Advisory lessons & student input
 - b. Normalize conversations about issues
 - c. Parent asked about accountability for social emotional lessons during advisory?
 2. Workplace climate & relationships will increase to an 85% satisfaction rate
 3. Professional satisfaction will increase to 80%
- iii. Family & Community Engagement
 1. 90% of parents will report satisfaction with engagement opportunities
 2. 90% of parents will report satisfaction with clarity, honesty, & transparency of communication from the school
 3. 61% of families will report that they can influence decision-making at the school
 - a. Mrs. Wall questioned the 35% data point from last year and asked about what it was in other years to have a point of comparison (since last year was a difficult year with the Covid guidelines)
 - b. Parent commented that parent satisfaction may be a slower climb due to the social conversation over curriculum in schools
 - c. Parent commented that the % is most likely skewed simply because those satisfied are not responding to the survey, but those who are dissatisfied are making their voice heard.
